Multiple Facets of GIScience

There are two alternative definitions of geographic information science: the use of GIS in scientific research, and the science that lies behind and enables GIS. This three-hour seminar will be led by Mike Goodchild, who coined the term in a 1992 article. It will provide ample opportunities to learn more about GIScience, to discuss the key elements of a GIScience curriculum, and to showcase the most significant principles and achievements of GIScience.

As GIS becomes easier to use and more accessible, hopefully students are able to devote more time to thinking critically about their data, the procedures they use, and the interpretation of their results. The seminar will devote time to exploring the nature of spatial thinking, and to ways of encouraging students to think more critically and creatively about what they are doing with GIS.
