How to Apply

Internships are approximately 12 weeks in length. Relocation, housing, and all living expenses are the responsibility of the intern. Students outside the United States are welcome to apply but must obtain a visa on their own to work for the summer. Students from other countries studying at U.S. universities must contact their university's international advisor to obtain a valid working visa.

Applications must be received by **March 1, 2009**.
Selected students will be notified by **April 10, 2009**.
