## Contribute Your Campus Data to the Esri Community Maps Program

### Make Your Campus Map Widely Accessible

By joining the Community Maps Program, you can make your campus basemap accessible to a wide audience. Faculty, students, and facility managers will all have access to the same basemap—one derived from and maintained with the authoritative content provided by the educational institution's data stewards.

The basemap can then be used to manage your facilities, including irrigation and safety/security areas, and can be embedded in your website so it's accessible to the public.

### Why Esri's Community Maps Program?

When you join the Community Maps Program, your campus data will be integrated with one of the ArcGIS<sup>SM</sup> Online basemaps, like World Topographic Map. Esri hosts all ArcGIS Online basemaps and makes them freely available, but you retain complete ownership of your data.

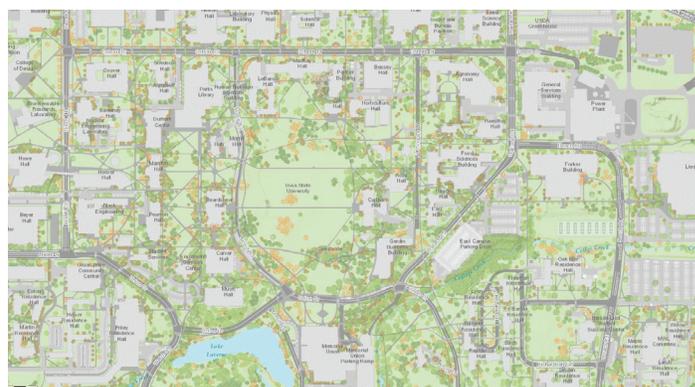
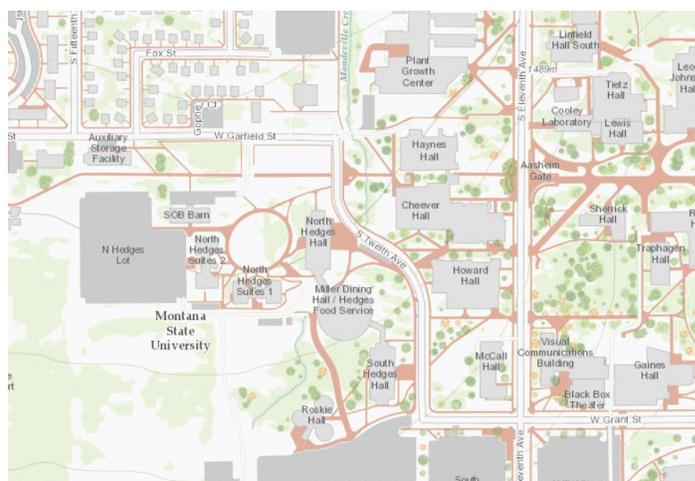
You also get

Contributing your campus data, whether it includes building footprints, sidewalks, or vegetation data, provides your internal users and the public with access to a unified, cartographically well-designed campus map. The campus map can be accessed through a standard Internet browser, ArcGIS® for Desktop, ArcGIS for Smartphones and Tablets, or custom applications.

### Getting Started

Participation in the program is free, and a wealth of resources is available to you. Esri has developed a downloadable campus basemap template to help you create a high-resolution, multiscale basemap for your campus and offers a complimentary two-day online workshop to guide you through the process.
