Evaluation Methods Used: Testing ArcGIS Desktop (ArcMap) involved a combination of manual and functional testing on desktop. The product was tested by certified accessibility professionals on a selection of the application representative of ArcGIS Desktop (ArcMap) using, among other methodology, screen reader review, exclusive use of the keyboard, and manual inspection of code. Functional testing of typical user workflows was also conducted.

Purpose
