Activity

Explore the physiographic and cultural attributes of the Arabian Peninsula.

- Describe the physical characteristics of the Arabian Peninsula.
- Understand the physiographic factors that affect the countries located on the Arabian Peninsula.

# 2 Ask

#### Where is the Arabian Peninsula located?

- → Click the link above to launch the map.
- → With the Details button underlined, click the button, Show Contents.
- ? Which continents surround and include the Arabian Peninsula? [Africa to the south and Europe to the northeast; the Arabian Peninsula is part of the continent of Asia]
- → Uncheck the box to the left of the layer name, Continents.

# Acquire

### What are the physical characteristics of the Arabian Peninsula?

- → Zoom in and click several different colors of the peninsula.
- ? Where on the Arabian Peninsula are there mountains (1 meter x 3.3 = number of feet)? [Along the west coast and the northeast coast]
- → Turn on the layer, Water Bodies. Click the layer name.
- → Click the Water Bodies sub-layer name, and then click the Show Legend button.
- → Pan and zoom the map to view the waterbodies on the Arabian Peninsula.
- ? What types of waterbodies are on the Arabian Peninsula? [Permanent and intermittent (dry during certain *times of the year)]*
- → Zoom in until the Springs and Streams layer names are not grayed out, and then turn on the layers.
- ? Where on the Arabian Peninsula is there no water at all? [The south-central part of the peninsula]
- ? Is there any relationship between landforms and the availability of water? [Mountains and areas of higher elevation have more surface water.]

# What type of land makes up the Arabian Peninsula?

- → Turn off the layers, Water Bodies, Springs, and Streams.
- → Turn on the layer, Annual Rainfall. View its legend.
- The rain in millimeters and 1 inch is equivalent to 25.4 mm. A desert is defined as a place that gets fewer than 10 inches of rain per year.
- ? How many millimeters is equal to 10 inches? [254 mm]
- ? Approximately what percentage of the Arabian Peninsula is desert? [70% to 90%]



# Analyze

### What are the temperature ranges on the Arabian Peninsula?

- → Turn off the layer, Annual Precipitation.
- → Turn on the layer, Temp: Sept Nov. View its legend.
- ? What is the approximate range of temperatures across the Arabian Peninsula from September to November? [14°C to 30°C or 57°F to 86°F]
- → Turn the temperature layers on and off one at a time to see the change of temperatures on the Arabian Peninsula through the four seasons. (Remember, click each layer name and view its legend.)
- ? What is the approximate range of temperatures across the Arabian Peninsula during the hottest season? [June to August: 18°C to 40°C or 66°F to 104°F]



### Act

#### Where would the most habitable land on the Arabian Peninsula be?

- → Turn on the layer, Ecozones.
- ? What is the relationship between the Arabian Peninsula's ecozones and its patterns of landforms, precipitation, and temperature? [The limited zones of temperate grassland on the Arabian Peninsula are found in the mountains, where there is more precipitation and milder temperatures.]
- ? Which of the region's physical characteristics would be considered most desirable for habitation? [Grassland ecosystems, areas with greater than 500 mm/20 inches of annual precipitation, and areas with access to permanent bodies of water or springs]

## **ZOOM TO A BOOKMARK**

- Click Bookmarks.
- Click a bookmark name to zoom to a map location and scale.

### TURN A MAP LAYER ON AND OFF

- Make sure that the Details pane is selected, and then click Contents.
- To show individual map layers, select the check boxes next to the layer names.
- Hint: If a map layer name is light gray, zoom in or out on the map until the layer name is black. The layer can now be turned on.
